The Kenora District Services Board (KDSB)

provides services to a catchment area of 407,000 km² ranging from the Manitoba border, to the east of Ignace, south to the Rainy River District and north to the 14th baseline.

The vast geography includes nine municipalities and four unincorporated territories with small villages and vast rural, remote areas.

The Kenora District encompasses 40 First Nations communities; some bordering municipalities, others situated far north






According to the 2016 Census, the population of the Kenora District has increased by **13.8%** from 2011.

The increase in population is **not uniform across households or age categories**.

Lone-parent family households is the fastest growing category


Family Household Change 2011 - 2020 District of Kenora





Over 67% of family households on Social Assistance are lone-parent households, making the need for support services and programs, especially housing and employment support programs, even more critical

The waiting list for affordable housing in the Kenora District has increased by over **114%** in the last five years.

At the end of 2017, there were **1084** approved applications for housing which included people in both active and offered status. This includes 75 Special Priority Placement Applications

SPP applications represent nearly 7% of the total wait list for housing.

- Dryden Urban Indigenous Homeward Bound Invitation
- Acquiring the former Pinewood School Property
 - Working with Keewatin-Patricia District School Board
 - Bill # empowers DSSABs and Municipalities to acquire surplus school properties.
 - Working with the City of Dryden to rezone the property
 - Needed to demonstrate that the development of Urban Indigenous programs and empowerment of Friendship Centres and Urban Indigenous Housing providers is also a responsibility of the community (the Municipality/DSSAB).
 - Rezoning Process: community consultations.
 - The consultations included the visit to 64 residences, apartments and businesses.
 - The discussions included the purchase of property, zoning, partners of the UIHB and breakdown of the project. Highlighting housing, childcare, job readiness and education.
- Rezoning process successful.




- The KDSB severed the lands and transferred the Ontario Aboriginal Housing Services for a nominal fee.
- The KDSB and the Dryden Native Friendship Centre developed a childcare program plan.
- The plan was approved as part of the Journey Together program. The program provided the capital and operating funding needed to establish a mainstream childcare program through a culturally appropriate framework based on traditional teachings.
